2009-10 STOCK MARKET REGIONAL GAME WINNERS

Back in September, Trinity's 7th & 8th grade class started playing the Stock Market Game. This game competes against other middle schools and high schools in New Hampshire to see which team would gain the greatest percentage of equity compared to the S&P 500. Each team was figuratively given \$100,000 to invest on the New York Stock Exchange until the game ended on April 30, 2010.

The "Money Makers" team consisting of Caitlyn Walker, Julianna Carroll, Peter Powers, and Bert LaChance **placed 1st out of 31 schools in our region and 14th in the state out of 190 schools**. From their initial investment of \$100,000 their total equity in cash and stock at the end of the game was \$117,279. The stocks that were big winners for this team were: Netflix with an increase of \$11,925, Nike at \$1,317, Hershey at \$1,062 and McDonald's at \$1,002.

The "Treacherous Trio" team comprised of Quentin Bazarnicki, Andrew Simmons, and Abby Konig **placed 3rd in the region and 20th in the state**. They ended the game with a total equity of \$114, 927. The big money makers for this team were: Netflix making \$5,254 and Apple making \$5,934.

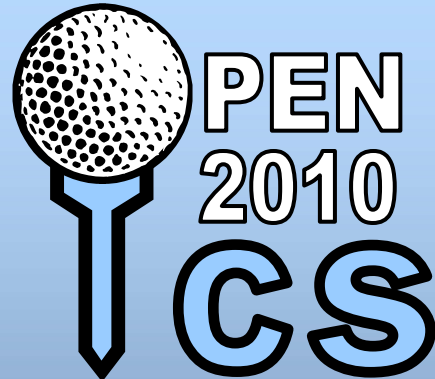
